Baird Core Plus Bond Fund Class Institutional

Gross expense ratio: 0.3% as of 05/01/2024

Objective: The investment seeks an annual rate of total return, before fund expenses, greater than the annual rate of total return of the

Bloomberg U.S. Universal Index.
